MATERIALS

1 skein Go Handmade Party Deluxe color Sky Blue
1 skein Friends Kid Silk color Arctic Blue (77)

Circular needles 5 mm, 40 cm
Circular needles 4.5 mm, 100 cm
Stitch marker
Tapestry needle

YARN QUALITY

 **Party Deluxe**, Go Handmade
100% polyester
50 g = 250 m

 **Friends Kid Silk**, Hobbii
72% Mohair, 25% Silk, 3% Wool
25 g = 200 m

KNITTING GAUGE

10 x 10 cm = 20 sts x 26 rows

ABBREVIATIONS

K = knit
P = purl

SIZE

One size

MEASUREMENTS

Length: 105 cm
Width: 15 cm

PATTERN INFORMATION

Ariel is a fine and festive slim scarf knitted from one thread Friends Kid Silk and one thread Party Deluxe together. Ariel is knitted in garter stitch and the shape is created through increases and decreases. To finish off, stitches are gathered up with two threads Friends Kid Silk along the edge of the entire scarf and i-cord is knit. The i-cord gives the scarf a slightly wavy edge.

The scarf can easily be made bigger. If you want a bigger scarf, remember to buy an extra skein of Friends Kid Silk.

The scarf is flexible and stretches, when the i-cord is worked on.

Difficulty: Intermediate

INFO AND TIPS

The scarf is flexible and stretches, when the i-cord is worked on. That means the gauge of the finished scarf is different from when the garter stitch is worked.

Place a stitch marker in the side where the increases/decreases are to be made. Then it's easier to remember which row you're on.

The scarf is worked in garter stitch, which means knit is worked on all rows.

If needed, you can use an extra 4.5 mm needle to work the i-cord.

SCARF

Cast on 3 stitches on needle 5 mm, 40 cm and knit 3 rows.

From here increases are made on every 6th row at the beginning of the row, by knitting in the front and back loop of the same stitch.

Row 1: knit in front and back loop of first stitch, knit to end of the row = 1 stitch increase

Row 2: knit

Row 3: knit

Row 4: knit

Row 5: knit

Row 6: knit

Repeat these 6 rows until the number of stitches is increased by 20 stitches = 23 sts on the needle

The scarf measures approx. 12 cm in width at this point.

If you want a wider scarf, continue with increases until you reach the desired width.

From here you'll decrease in the same side as the increases:

Row 1: knit 2 stitches together, knit to end of the row = 1 stitch decrease

Row 2: knit

Row 3: knit
Row 4: knit
Row 5: knit
Row 6: knit

Repeat these 6 rows until there are 3 stitches left. Knit 3 rows. Bind off and weave the end.

I-cord

With two threads Friends Kid Silk and needle 4.5 mm, 100 cm, one stitch from every row is gathered onto the needle along the edge of the entire scarf (approx. 500 stitches). Start in the middle of the top edge of the scarf.

Cast on 4 stitches.

k3, knit 2 together through back loops. Place the 4 stitches back on the left needle

- Repeat until 4 stitches remain on the needle. Bind off the 4 stitches and sew the i-cord edge together.



Your scarf is now finished :)
